The Church is now open for congregational worship. It has been quite a while since we were able to worship together in person, and it is very possible that you might like to wait a few more weeks before coming back yourself. That is absolutely fine, and you will continue to get your News and Service sheets delivered every week.

There are a few changes required by the Government to help protect you if you do come; there will be door Stewards there to help you.

- Masks must be worn by everyone, except the preacher and readers when speaking (unless you are exempt of course).
- The pews are marked out to help you, or your family group, sit at least 2metres apart – not all pews are in use.
- Singing is not allowed (you can hum or mime!)
- No 'in-pew' collection, but there will be bowls for envelopes etc on your way out.
