Readings: 1 Kings 19: 3-8

(NIV)

Our first reading is set just after the prophet Elijah has been instrumental in the killing of all 850 of Queen Jezebel's priests of the false god, Baal, and she is seeking vengeance on Elijah.

Elijah flees to Horeb

Elijah was afraid and ran for his life. When he came to Beersheba in Judah, he left his servant there, while he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness. He came to a broom bush, sat down under it and prayed that he might die. 'I have had enough, Lord,' he said. 'Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors.' Then he lay down under the bush and fell asleep.

All at once an angel touched him and said, 'Get up and eat.' He looked around, and there by his head was some bread baked over hot coals, and a jar of water. He ate and drank and then lay down again.

The angel of the Lord came back a second time and touched him and said, 'Get up and eat, for the journey is too much for you.' So he got up and ate and drank. Strengthened by that food, he travelled for forty days and forty nights until he reached Horeb, the mountain of God. There he went into a cave and spent the night.

Then Jesus declared, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.'

At this the Jews there began to grumble about him because he said, 'I am the bread that came down from heaven.' They said, 'Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, "I came down from heaven"?''

'Stop grumbling among yourselves,' Jesus answered. 'No-one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws them, and I will raise them up at the last day. It is written in the Prophets: "They will all be taught by God." Everyone who has heard the Father and learned from him comes to me. No-one has seen the Father except the one who is from God; only he has seen the Father. Very truly I tell you, the one who believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, yet they died. But here is the bread that comes down from heaven, which anyone may eat and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live for ever. This bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world.'

We pray for all who are sick, some known to us, others not, but all are known to you. Bring healing and peace to all who suffer, and to those who care for them. We think of any who are experiencing mental health problems, that they may find a sense of calm; and grant your peace to any whose life is drawing to a close.

And we pray for ourselves, our families and friends, that we may be inspired by your love sweeping through us, so that, made strong in faith, we may be enabled to carry out the work to which you have called us.
